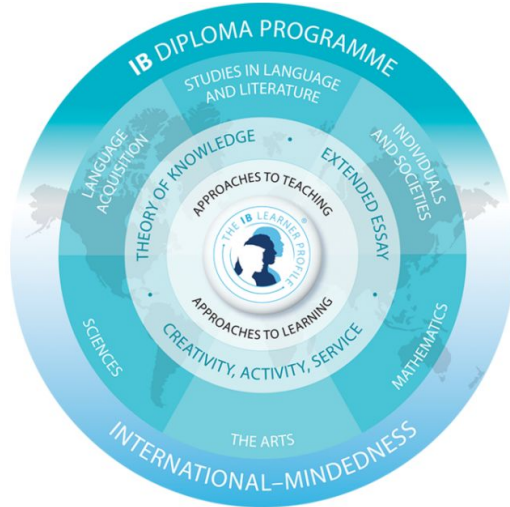
The IGS Mission
